

Revelation Chapter 16 Speaker Notes

Every July 4th we celebrate the independence of our country. All across America, cities and towns put on aerial fireworks displays as part of that celebration. At the end of the fireworks show, there is always a finale with a plethora of these skyrocket fireworks sent heavenward in a massive, rapid-fire presentation of exploding light and booming sound. At the end of this finale, cheering and applause can be heard as we all join in celebrating the most momentous event in our history. This 16th chapter in Revelation describes for us another kind of finale, the finale of God's judgment on the earth dwellers. The angels, one after the other, will be pouring out the seven bowl judgments, at the end of which we will celebrate the redemptive work of our Creator God!

All seven of the bowls full of God's wrath are poured out in rapid succession causing devastation to the rivers and the sea, and mankind is inflicted with malignant sores and scorching heat. Then the kingdom of the beast is plunged into total darkness after which the Euphrates River is dried up, permitting the crossing of an enormous army, heading toward the land of Israel. Meanwhile three evil spirits are released to go out into the rest of the world to gather all peoples together for the great battle of Armageddon. As the seventh bowl is poured out, there is a proclamation stating, "It is done!" Following that, there is an earthquake so strong that all islands disappear and all mountains are flattened.

Even though these are cataclysmic events that impact every creature on earth, they do not come without plenty of warnings and opportunities for the earthly inhabitants to repent and submit to the one and only true God. Just before the finale begins, the permanent earth dwellers will be given one final chance to repent as we saw back in chapter 14 where three angels fly through the skies proclaiming:

- Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water. (Revelation 14:7)
- Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great, she who made all nations drink the wine of the passion of her sexual immorality. (Revelation 14:8)
- If anyone worships the beast and its image and receives a mark on his forehead or on his hand, he also will drink the wine of God's wrath, poured full strength into the cup of his anger, and he will be tormented with fire and sulfur in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb. (Revelation 14:9-10)

And with this last warning, the finale commences.

Many commentators on the book of Revelation see the seven Trumpet Judgments and these seven Bowl Judgments as either different perspectives of the same events or as separate events that occur at the same time. We do not believe that either of these is accurate. Just because descriptions are similar and appear in generally the same order, we cannot assume that they are the same events or that they occur at the same time. The seven trumpet judgments appear to happen over a long period of time (years) whereas the seven bowl judgments appear to happen very rapidly (weeks, at most). For instance, the sores experienced from the first bowl judgment still have not been healed at the time of the fifth bowl judgment. As another evidence that these judgments come rapidly, consider that mankind could not survive for more than a couple of weeks with the oceans and rivers turned to blood.

As further evidence that these are not the same judgments or different perspectives of the same judgments, notice that the trumpet judgments typically only affect 1/3 of things (1/3 of trees burned, the death of 1/3 of the sea creatures, 1/3 of rivers turned to blood, 1/3 of light from sun, moon, & stars affected) whereas the bowl judgements affect all (*all* who have the mark of the beast are affected, *all* sea creatures die, *all* rivers become blood). As we go through this chapter, we will point out some of these differences.

So, without further ado, here is the finale of God's judgment on the permanent earth dwellers. The sanctuary is filled with smoke, the destruction of Babylon has been declared, the eternal gospel has been proclaimed to every nation and tribe and language and people, and the mighty angel with the little scroll has announced that there will be no more delay. Now, the unrestrained wrath of God is poured out on the earth and the permanent earth dwellers with such devastation that anyone experiencing the bowls of wrath cannot deny the existence or the supremacy of God any longer. And yet, as we will see, the permanent earth dwellers, clearly recognizing that these come from Almighty God, will still refuse to repent of their sinfulness as they blaspheme the God of all creation.

Are you ready? Here it comes!

Revelation 16:1

Then I heard a loud voice from the temple telling the seven angels, "Go and pour out on the earth the seven bowls of the wrath of God."

"a loud voice from the temple" – based on the last verse of the previous chapter, this must be God talking and the sanctuary was filled with smoke from the glory of God and from his power, and no one could enter the sanctuary until the seven plagues of the seven angels were finished. (Revelation 15:8)

These seven angels are the ones who have the seven bowls full of God's wrath which are about to be poured out on the earth and its inhabitants.

Revelation 16: 2

So the first angel went and poured out his bowl on the earth, and harmful and painful sores came upon the people who bore the mark of the beast and worshiped its image.

The first bowl is poured out on the earth and it affected only those who have the mark of the beast and those who worship his image. In contrast, the first trumpet (Revelation 8:7) involved the throwing of hail and fire upon the earth and ½ of all the trees being burned up. The first trumpet judgment and the first bowl judgment do not appear to have anything in common with each other.

"harmful" – This is the Greek word *kakos*, an adjective which describes something which is bad in its very nature. It is derived from the verb *chazō*, which means to give back or to retreat in battle. It is used of a soldier who runs instead of fighting.

"painful" – This is the Greek word *ponēros*, an adjective describing something as evil, malicious, wicked, hurtful, or painful. It is sometimes translated as malignant.

"sores" – From the Greek word *helkos*, which refers to a boil full of oozing pus. In the Septuagint (Greek translation of the Old Testament) it is the word that is used to describe the plague of boils inflicted on the Egyptians (the sixth plague - Exodus 9:8-12).

Notice that the plague of this first bowl judgment only affects those who have the mark of the beast and those who worship his image. It does not affect believers who have stayed faithful to the true God.

Revelation 16:3

The second angel poured out his bowl into the sea, and it became like the blood of a corpse, and every living thing died that was in the sea.

The second bowl is poured out on the sea. Notice that the second trumpet (something like a great mountain, burning with fire thrown into the sea - Revelation 8:8, 9) only affects ½ of the sea (becomes blood) whereas this affects all of the sea (becomes blood like the blood of a dead man) and every living creature in the sea died. Some have speculated that this only refers to the Mediterranean Sea not all the seas of the world. This is similar to the first plague on Egypt where all water became blood (Exodus 7:15-25). However, since the other bowls seem to affect the entire earth, it is reasonable to believe that this means all the oceans of the earth.

"it became like the blood of a corpse" – The placement of the word "like" is critically important to interpreting the Greek text. The Greek word hōs, meaning "like" or "as" appears after the word for blood, not before. Thus, this verse should read, "it became blood like that of a corpse." This plague will actually turn the sea into blood like that of a dead man, the thick dark coagulated blood which quickly begins to stink. The effect of this will be that all oceanic life from the smallest plankton to the largest sea mammal will die. All hydrologic processes will cease. Therefore, all weather systems will cease as well. All the dead animals will wash up on ocean shores around the world and will rot and stink! The oceans themselves will become a cesspool of stinking, rotten, putrefying coagulated blood and dead bodies.

Revelation 16:4-7

The third angel poured out his bowl into the rivers and the springs of water, and they became blood. And I heard the angel in charge of the waters say, "Just are you, O Holy One, who is and who was, for you brought these judgments. For they have shed the blood of saints and prophets, and you have given them blood to drink. It is what they deserve!" And I heard the altar saying, "Yes, Lord God the Almighty, true and just are your judgments!"

The third bowl is poured out on the rivers and sources of water. Notice that the third trumpet only affected ½ of the rivers and sources of water (Rev 8:10, 11). This bowl judgment affects them all.

- "springs" This is from $p\bar{e}gas$, meaning "a fountain or spring" in the sense of being the source of water. This could also refer to snow pack and glaciers as the source of rivers and springs.
- "angel in charge of the waters" The Greek text reads "angel of the waters." Compare this to the angels of the four winds (Revelation 7:1) and the angel who has power over fire (Revelation 14:18). It was a common opinion among the Hebrews that the angels presided over elements, and that each element was committed to the jurisdiction of a particular angel. Since this is the angel having responsibility for the waters it is appropriate that he should be the one to declare God as righteous in his destruction of the waters as a judgment on unbelieving mankind.
- "who is to be" This phrase is included in some translations after "who is and who was," but is not in the best Greek manuscripts and probably should be omitted. In its place in most manuscripts is the word *hosios*, meaning Holy one.
- "And I heard the altar saying,"—The word translated "altar" is in the genitive case implying "of the altar" or "from the altar." It is not the altar itself saying something otherwise the word translated "altar" would be in the nominative or accusative case. It is possible that what John heard was the unified voice of the martyred saints under the altar affirming what the angel has just declared, that God is acting in

righteousness and justice as he passes judgment on the world of unrepentant mankind, see Revelation 6:9-10. Some Greek texts say, "And I heard another (of the same kind) out of the altar say ..."

Revelation 16:8, 9

The fourth angel poured out his bowl on the sun, and it was allowed to scorch people with fire. They were scorched by the fierce heat, and they cursed the name of God who had power over these plagues. They did not repent and give him glory.

The fourth bowl is poured out on the sun. Notice that the fourth trumpet judgment (Revelation 8:12) affected the sun, moon, and stars so that they did not shine ½ as much as previously. This judgment is on the sun only and it is not an absence of light that occurs, but burning heat.

"to scorch" – This is the Greek word *kaumatidzō*, which means to burn, and the word "fire" is from the Greek word *pur*. Therefore, the sun was given power to burn men with fire. This is more than just a sever sun burn from ultraviolet rays. Instead, it appears to be an intense heat from infrared rays that burns like fire.

This same burning has been described as part of the Day of the Lord in the Old Testament:

"For behold, the day is coming, **burning like an oven**, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. (Malachi 4:1)

Therefore a curse devours the earth, and its inhabitants suffer for their guilt; therefore the **inhabitants** of the earth are scorched, and few men are left. (Isaiah 24:6)

Moreover, the light of the moon will be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun will be sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day when the LORD binds up the brokenness of his people, and heals the wounds inflicted by his blow. (Isaiah 30:26)

"they cursed the name of God" – The reaction of the permanent earth dwellers is not repentance, but defiance of God. They did not repent of their deeds and they did not give glory to God. Their refusal to submit seals their sentence of suffering and death.

This may seem strange to someone who believes in the one true God. However, keep in mind that the Beast will claim to be a god and will demonstrate it with miraculous signs performed by his false prophet. Even today there is a growing belief that a man can become a god. It won't take very much evidence to convince the permanent earth dwellers of that time that the Beast really is a god. It is very likely that he will proclaim himself to be equal to Yahweh God and that he will declare war against the Jews and their God. Since the people who receive the mark of the beast will be devoted to the beast, they will also consider Jehovah God to be their enemy and will willingly blaspheme His name.

Could anyone but God (or a god) cause the sun to produce such burning heat? The permanent earth dwellers will recognize that the scorching sun is caused by Yahweh and yet – they will still not accept Him as The God.

Revelation 16:10, 11

The fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and its kingdom was plunged into darkness. People gnawed their tongues in anguish and cursed the God of heaven for their pain and sores. They did not repent of their deeds.

The fifth bowl is poured out on the throne of the beast. Compare this to the fifth trumpet (Revelation 9:1-12) in which a fallen angel is given the key to the abyss and he releases smoke causing the sun and

moon to be darkened and, along with the smoke come demons from the abyss. In the fifth bowl judgment there are no demons involved, just darkness so intense that it produces pain. Though it is said that the bowl is poured out on the throne it is clear that the entire kingdom of the beast is affected. Since he is the world ruler, it appears that the darkness extends to the entire world.

Will the earth dwellers believe that the sun has actually burned itself out? How else will they explain that the sun suddenly became seven times as hot (like we're told in Isaiah30:6) and then just as suddenly went dark? They will have to provide some scientific explanation if they refuse to believe in Yahweh. However, if we look at Isaiah 13:10, we discover that the darkness is not just a lack of sunlight, but a complete darkness in which even the moon and stars refuse to shine.

For the stars of the heavens and their constellations will not give their light; the sun will be dark at its rising, and the moon will not shed its light. (Isaiah 13:10)

This judgment is similar to the ninth plague inflicted on the Egyptians (Exodus 10:21-29). In that Egyptian plague, the darkness was so severe that it could be felt:

Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt, a darkness to be felt." (Exodus 10:21)

Similarly, the darkness of this fifth bowl judgment produces pain which is so excruciating that it causes men to gnaw on their tongues. Also, it appears that, like this plague of darkness, the darkness thrust upon the Egyptians was more than just lack of sunlight:

So Moses stretched out his hand toward heaven, and there was pitch darkness in all the land of Egypt three days. They did not see one another, nor did anyone rise from his place for three days, but all the people of Israel had light where they lived. (Exodus 10:22, 23)

Here is the darkness of the fifth bowl judgment as seen by a couple of the Old Testament prophets:

a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! (Joel 2:2a)

A day of wrath is that day, a day of distress and anguish, a day of ruin and devastation, a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness, (Zephaniah 1:15)

"... and cursed the God of heaven for their pain and sores." - The word "pain" is from the Greek word *ponos*, which is from the same root as *ponēros* from verse two, meaning "pain." The word translated "sores" is from *helkos*, the same word used in verse two to describe the pustering boils of the first plague. It appears from this verse that the bowl judgments are poured out so rapidly that there is insufficient time for mankind to recover from former bowl judgments.

The cumulative effect of the painful sores, fouled oceans, lack of fresh water for drinking or cleansing of sores, intense heat, all engulfed in thick darkness, will bring unbearable misery. The effect that these plagues have on mankind is to produce cursing, not repentance. Just as Pharaoh hardened his heart against God, so will unbelieving mankind in the last days harden their hearts against God.

"did not repent of their deeds" – This is the last mention of their lack of repentance. Just as Pharaoh resisted God by hardening his heart until God finally declared his heart hard, so mankind during these final plagues will refuse to repent until God finally declares them unrepentant and unleashes the final two bowl judgments on them.

Revelation 16:12-14

The sixth angel poured out his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up, to prepare the way for the kings from the east. And I saw, coming out of the mouth of the dragon and out of the mouth of the beast and out of the mouth of the false prophet, three unclean spirits

like frogs. For they are demonic spirits, performing signs, who go abroad to the kings of the whole world, to assemble them for battle on the great day of God the Almighty.

The sixth bowl is poured out on the great river Euphrates. Compare this to the sixth trumpet judgment (Revelation 9:13-21) where the four demons are released from the great river Euphrates. In this case, the river is dried up (no weather system to cause rain or snow and scorching heat to melt the snow pack) which will allow the kings of the east to cross to Israel. These kings will be joined by all other kings under control of the beast and all will be gathered by the three unclean spirits.

The drying-up of this river may have been the subject of prophesy in the Old Testament:

And the LORD will utterly destroy the tongue of the Sea of Egypt, and will wave his hand over the River with his scorching breath, and strike it into seven channels, and he will lead people across in sandals. (Isaiah 11:15)

He shall pass through the sea of troubles and strike down the waves of the sea, and all the depths of the Nile shall be dried up. (Zechariah 10:11a)

"three unclean spirits like frogs" – Frogs were considered unclean animals and their slimy filthiness is an indication of the vileness of these three unclean spirits. These three spirits are apparently Satan (out of the mouth of the dragon) and two other demons who indwelt the beast and the false prophet. These three spirits will perform signs to draw the kings of the earth to the battle of the great day of God Almighty (the day of the LORD). It is possible that one of the signs they perform is to provide light for the armies to see their way to Israel.

Revelation 16:15

("Behold, I am coming like a thief! Blessed is the one who stays awake, keeping his garments on, that he may not go about naked and be seen exposed!")

God pronounces that he is coming as a thief. This image has been used in several places as a reference to the Day of the LORD, that day of His judgment on mankind.

Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. (Matthew 24:42, 43)

For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. (1 Thessalonians 5:2)

But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. (2 Peter 3:10)

Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you. (Revelation 3:3)

"Blessed is the one who stays awake, keeping his garments on, that he may not go about naked and be seen exposed." – This is apparently a military reference to soldiers who are alert and fully dressed for battle. Those who are not alert and not ready will be seen in their dereliction and will be ashamed. This is also a beatitude directed at those who have not received the mark of the beast but who are anxiously awaiting the return of the Lord. It's as if the Lord is telling them, "Keep the faith!"

Revelation 16:16

And they assembled them at the place that in Hebrew is called Armageddon.

The narrative returns again to the work that the three unclean spirits will do in gathering the kings of the earth to the battle of the great day of the Lord's wrath. They will be gathered to a place which in Hebrew is called *Har-Mageddōn* which literally means "the mountain of Meggido." But there is no hill or mountain in Israel named Mount Meggido. Therefore, it is believed by many that this refers to the hill country surrounding the plain of Meggido which is located some sixty miles north of Jerusalem.

Dr. Michael Heiser in his book "The Unseen Realm" makes a pretty convincing case for this to be *Har-Mo'ed* rather than *Har-Megeddon*. *Har-Mo'ed* means "the mountain of assembly" which would be Mt. Zion, the hill upon which Jerusalem is built. This also makes more sense since when Christ comes, He will set his feet on the Mount of Olives, across the Kidron Valley from Jerusalem. Also, it is commonly believed that the Kidron Valley is the same as the Valley of Jehoshaphat referred to by the prophet Joel

I will gather all the nations and bring them down to the Valley of Jehoshaphat. And I will enter into judgment with them there, on behalf of my people and my heritage Israel, because they have scattered them among the nations and have divided up my land, (Joel 3:2)

Let the nations stir themselves up and come up to the Valley of Jehoshaphat; for there I will sit to judge all the surrounding nations. (Joel 3:12)

This battle (slaughter) will be brief and devastating as Jesus Christ returns in all His glory and defeats his enemies with the words of his mouth,

Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse! The one sitting on it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems, and he has a name written that no one knows but himself. He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God. And the armies of heaven, arrayed in fine linen, white and pure, were following him on white horses. From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. He will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty. On his robe and on his thigh he has a name written, King of kings and Lord of lords. (Rev 19:11-16)

Since it appears that the world is still shrouded in thick darkness, the brightness of the glory of God will be all the more spectacular (and probably painful).

Revelation 16:17-21

The seventh angel poured out his bowl into the air, and a loud voice came out of the temple, from the throne, saying, "It is done!" And there were flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder, and a great earthquake such as there had never been since man was on the earth, so great was that earthquake. The great city was split into three parts, and the cities of the nations fell, and God remembered Babylon the great, to make her drain the cup of the wine of the fury of his wrath. And every island fled away, and no mountains were to be found. And great hailstones, about one hundred pounds each, fell from heaven on people; and they cursed God for the plague of the hail, because the plague was so severe.

"It is done!" – The voice of God declaring that with this bowl the judgment of mankind is completed. This phrase is translated from the Greek word, *gegonen*, which is the perfect tense of the verb meaning to come into existence. Therefore, this means something has come into being with the effect that it now exists. As used in this verse it implies that God has accomplished what He intended to do; He has executed judgment on unbelieving mankind. He has done it, and it is done!

Compare this with what Christ said on the cross as he completed payment for our sins:

When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished," and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit. (John 19:30)

The phrase "It is finished!" is from the Greek word *tetelestai*, which also is a perfect tense word. This word means it has been completed therefore it is now complete or finished.

"the great city" – For the identification of this city we need look no further than:

and their dead bodies will lie in the street of the great city that symbolically is called Sodom and Egypt, where their Lord was crucified. (Revelation 11:8)

The reaction from God's proclamation is flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder, and a great earthquake. This is the greatest earthquake that has ever struck the earth. It is far greater than the earthquake that accompanied the sixth seal judgment. As a result of this earthquake Jerusalem is divided into three parts, all the other cities of the world are destroyed, all islands disappear, and all mountains are laid flat.

This flattening of the mountains was predicted by Isaiah as a preparation for the return of the Lord to set up His millennial kingdom

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. *Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.* And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." (Isaiah 40:1-5)

We must also compare this to what we are told in the second chapter of Isaiah:

It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. (Isaiah 2:2-4)

This passage is a description of the Millennium. Jerusalem will be the highest point on earth during the Millennium (because of the earthquake of the seventh bowl.)

This is probably not a tectonic earthquake (produced by shifting of portions of the earth's crust). A tectonic earthquake can't be large enough to reshape the crust of the earth. It is more likely that this is the result of a meteorite or a comet crashing into the earth. An excellent treatise on this occurrence is contained in the book "The Comets of God," by Dr. Jeffrey Goodman, Ph.D.

"the fury of his wrath" – Literally this reads, "the wrath of His anger." The word "wrath" is from *thumos* which describes a passionate outburst of anger and the word "anger" is from *orgē* which describes anger as a state of mind. According to John Walvoord,

The combination of *thumos* and *orge* connotes the strongest kind of outpouring of divine judgment.

All of these judgments indicate the beginning of the Day of the Lord, a time of outpouring of God's anger against sinners. Compare Zechariah's description of the Day of the LORD, including the second coming of Christ:

On that day his feet shall stand on the Mount of Olives that lies before Jerusalem on the east, and the Mount of Olives shall be split in two from east to west by a very wide valley, so that one half of the Mount shall move northward, and the other half southward. And you shall flee to the valley of my mountains, for the valley of the mountains shall reach to Azal. And you shall flee as you fled from the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah. Then the LORD my God will come, and all the holy ones with him. On that day there shall be no light, cold, or frost. And there shall be a unique day, which is known to the LORD, neither day nor night, but at evening time there shall be light. On that day living waters shall flow out from Jerusalem, half of them to the eastern sea and half of them to the western sea. It shall continue in summer as in winter. And the LORD will be king over all the earth. On that day the LORD will be one and his name one. The whole land shall be turned into a plain from Geba to Rimmon south of Jerusalem. But Jerusalem shall remain aloft on its site from the Gate of Benjamin to the place of the former gate, to the Corner Gate, and from the Tower of Hananel to the king's winepresses. And it shall be inhabited, for there shall never again be a decree of utter destruction. Jerusalem shall dwell in security. And this shall be the plague with which the LORD will strike all the peoples that wage war against Jerusalem: their flesh will rot while they are still standing on their feet, their eyes will rot in their sockets, and their tongues will rot in their mouths. And on that day a great panic from the LORD shall fall on them, so that each will seize the hand of another, and the hand of the one will be raised against the hand of the other. Even Judah will fight at Jerusalem. And the wealth of all the surrounding nations shall be collected, gold, silver, and garments in great abundance. (Zechariah 14:4-14)

Following the earthquake, great hail weighing about 100 pounds per hail stone will fall from the skies. **and they cursed God!** Even in their final hour of judgment they will not submit to almighty God.

We need to point out again that hailstones that large are not possible from the normal updraft formation of typical hailstones. This is most likely the result of a comet colliding with the earth, or the earth passing through a comet's tail.

So What?

Let's quickly recap these 7 last plagues. They start out with excruciatingly painful, ugly boils full of foul-smelling pus, suddenly breaking out on all the permanent earth dwellers. Then, all the oceans become blood like that of a dead man and every living thing in the ocean dies. Next, every river and lake become blood because all sources of water become blood. Between the blood and the dead bodies, there will be a horrifically foul smell that is likely to permeate the entire planet. Then the sun becomes scorching hot so that no one can bear to be outside. This will serve to intensify the smell of rotting organisms. It will be followed by the most intense darkness anyone can imagine. And, what do the earth dwellers do? Do they fall before God and beg for mercy? No – they curse God! The next thing most people will experience is the most massive earthquake ever imagined. This will cause death and destruction on a world-wide scale! The Day of the Lord has arrived!

Now, let's come back to the present for a minute. Today, there is a definite anti-Christian sentiment growing in this country, coupled with a growing world-wide, anti-Jewish sentiment. Unfortunately, the witness of Christians is also growing weaker with each passing day. In the past two years alone, the percentage of regular church attendees in the United States has dropped from 34% of the population to 28% of the population, and that includes churches, synagogues, and mosques. That's nearly a 20% drop

in regular attendance. And, since the year 2000, Christian church membership has dropped 33%. Christians are supposed to be the salt of the earth, acting as a preservative and enhancer of the quality of life. We seem to have lost our saltiness. We are also supposed to light the way for others to see God.

You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven. (Matthew 5:13-16)

The United States with its large Christian population has been one of the major deterrents to assaults against the Jewish people throughout the world. But, consider this: once the rapture occurs and true Christians are taken out of the way, the persecution of Jews will increase tremendously. With the absence of Christians, the United States may even turn against Israel, the way many other nations in the world are doing today. And, shortly after the rapture, the anti-Christ will come to power, appearing like the champion of peace and protector of the Jewish people.

However, this "protector of the Jews" will soon become a self-proclaimed god and adversary of the Jewish people and their God. In spite of Yahweh's two prophetic witnesses (who will be killed by the anti-Christ) and the 144,000 sealed witnesses, the vast majority of the people on planet earth will see the anti-Christ as the god of this world. They will be fooled into believing that the signs and wonders performed by the false prophet are demonstrations of the power of the gods. They will believe the propaganda that claims that the God of the Jews, the One True God, is an evil being and that the only way for lasting peace is to obliterate the Jewish nation and all of its people.

This is the world we are walking into. The days of easy-believe-ism are gone, along with the days of casual witnessing. We need to be intentional if we are going to reach the lost. It is not just the eleventh hour; my friends, the clock is at 11:59 and it's ticking.

What are you going to do about it?

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
